STAND BY THEM

Stand by Me is a great film about the joys and trials of growing up as a boy. One of the heroes and the narrator of the tale is Gordy Lachance. His older brother was a star athlete and his parents' obvious favorite. Now the older brother has died, and in their grief, Gordy's parents have totally lost sight of their younger boy. Through flashbacks we learn that even when the older brother was alive, the parents only had eyes for him. They couldn't see the less obvious gifts the younger boy had, and so he doubted those gifts himself.

Families are a great place to nurture the abilities, skills, talents, and gifts of the young. Many accomplished artists and performers and business people say their parents and family members were the ones who recognized their talents at an early age and set them on the course of success. Yet families can also squelch budding talent and latent interests early on.

Here are three steps you can take to nurture the gifts of young people in your care. 1. Watch, listen, and learn. Notice what interests the child has and what activities they seem to have a knack for. 2. Give your feedback. Cheer their successes and stand by them when they fail. Failure is a big part of developing our talents. 3. Let them know their gifts are from God and that they are meant for the good of the world.

Next week's scripture insights:

Readings for Sunday, January 20, 2019 • Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: Is 62:1-5 ✞ Ps 96:1-3, 7-10 ✞ 1 Co 12:4-11 ✞ John 2:1-12

Think of these first weeks after Christmas as a season of "epiphanies." The Liturgy is showing us Who Jesus is and what He has revealed about our relationship with God.

Last week and the week before, the imagery was royal and filial – Jesus is the newborn king of the Jews who makes us co-heirs of Israel's promise, beloved children of God. Last week in the Liturgy we went to a Baptism.

This week we're at a wedding. We're being shown another dimension of our relationship with God. If we're sons and daughters of God, it's because we've married into the family.

Have you ever wondered why the Bible begins and ends with a wedding – Adam and Eve's in the garden and the marriage supper of the Lamb (compare [Genesis 2:23-24](#) and [Revelation 19:9; 21:9; 22:17](#))?

Throughout the Bible, marriage is the symbol of the covenant relationship God desires with His chosen people. He is the Groom, humanity His beloved and sought-after bride. We see this reflected beautifully in today's First Reading.

When Israel breaks the covenant she is compared to an unfaithful spouse (see [Jeremiah 2:20-36; 3:1-13](#)). But God promises to take her back, to "espouse" her to Him forever in an everlasting covenant (see [Hosea 2:18-22](#)).

That's why in today's Gospel, Jesus performs His first public "sign" at a wedding feast.

Jesus is the divine Bridegroom (see [John 3:29](#)), calling us to His royal wedding feast (see [Matthew 22:1-14](#)). By His New Covenant, He will become "one flesh" with all humanity in the Church (see [Ephesians 5:21-33](#)). By our Baptism, each of us has been betrothed to Christ as a bride to a Husband (see [2 Corinthians 11:2](#)).

The new wine that Jesus pours out at today's feast is the gift of the Holy Spirit given to His bride and body, as today's Epistle says. This is the "salvation" announced to the "families of nations" in today's Psalm.

Thoughts to Consider this week ~

SERVICE WITH A SMILE

Service mottos abound, ranging from "The customer is always right" to "Ours is not to question why, ours is but to do or die." At a particular nuptial celebration in Cana, servants in the middle of a supply crisis were told to follow the instructions of a young man who made puzzling demands of them. As a result of their obedience, ordinary water became fine wine. The crisis turned into a triumph. When we listen to Jesus and act on what we hear—the very definition of "obedience"—marvels ensue. Gospel always starts out sounding incredible, until it's reality.

THE LEGACY LIVES ON—THE STRUGGLE AS WELL

When Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated, the outcry from other faith leaders was immediate. Pope Paul VI called King a "prophet." The National Conference of Catholic Bishops joined in a widespread interfaith statement, "bow[ing] together in grief before the shameful murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., a unique apostle of the nonviolent drive for justice . . . no service of remembrance or local memorial is equal to the greatness of his labor or the vastness of our national need." What can St. Rose of Lima parish family do with other churches in the ongoing effort to end racism?

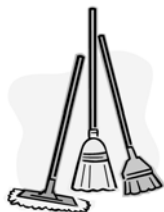
